





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Recipes and Symbolism

(for Lesson 10)

Matzoh Bread

- 4 cups unbleached flour
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1½ cups water (room temperature)

Combine flour and salt with enough water to form a nonsticky ball. Knead for 5-10 minutes. Shape into a ball, cut in half, cut each half into 8 pieces. Form 16 balls and roll each into a 7-inch circle. Bake on an ungreased cookie sheet at 500° F for 5 minutes.

Haroseth

- 1½ cups chopped nuts
- 1½ cups diced apples (peeled)
- 3 teaspoons cinnamon
- 3 tablespoons sugar sparkling red grape juice

Either mix together as is or, preferably, blend together at high speed to form a paste, adding sparkling red grape juice as needed.

Symbolism

- 1. Pouring juice from one container shows we are one in God. (Pour juice in cups.)
- 2. The candle reminds us that God promised to send us a light in our darkness. (Light candle.) Jesus is the light.
- 3. Parsley reminds us that nature comes to life in springtime.
- 4. Salt water reminds us of the tears and the sweat of the enslaved Jews in Egypt. (Dip parsley in salt water and eat.)
- 5. Matzoh, made without yeast, reminds us of the rush to leave Egypt with no time to let the bread rise. (Break bread and give a piece to each student.)
- 6. Bitter herbs remind us of the bitter lives of the enslaved Jews, as well as Jesus' death. (Taste horseradish.)
- 7. Haroseth looks like the mortar the Jews used to build Pharaoh's cities. (Scoop matzoh in haroseth and eat.)
- 8. Juice reminds us of the blood of Jesus, which forgives sins. (Drink juice.)
- 9. Lamb reminds us of the blood of the lamb on the doorposts so the angel of death would pass over. (Eat cookie.)
