

The memory verse activities described here are recommended as teaching and review activities. These activities were suggested for use in Sabbath School.

LESSON 1

Use the suggested motions as you say the memory verse together.

“[Jesus said,] Point upward.

‘Anyone who Spread arms open wide.

wants to be first Hold up index finger.

must be the Hold up little finger.
very last.’”

Mark 9:35 Palms together;
then open.

LESSON 2

Use the following motions as you say the memory verse.

“The Lord Point upward.

is with me; Point to self.

I will not Shake head no.

be afraid.” Hug self.

Psalm 118:6 Put palms together;
then open.

LESSON 3

Use the suggested motions as you say the memory verse.

“Tell Cup your hands
around your mouth.

how much God Point up.

has done for you.” . . . Point at each other.

Luke 8:39 Put palms together;
then open

LESSON 4

Read the memory verse as a choral reading.

Teacher: “[Jesus said,]

Child: “You should do

Teacher: as I have done

Child: for you.”

Together: John 13:15

Change parts and repeat.

LESSON 5

Use the suggested motions as you say the memory verse.

“Pray Fold hands in front
of you.

to me, and I Point index finger
upward.

will listen Touch ears with
hands.

to you.” Point outward.

Jeremiah 29:12 Put palms together;
then open.

LESSON 6

Use the suggested motions as you say the memory verse.

“Let us go March in place.

to the house Fingertips together,
still marching.

of the Lord.” Spread arms open
wide to the sky, still
marching.

Psalms 122:1 Put palms together;
then open.

LESSON 7

Use the suggested motions as you say the memory verse.

“Give Move right hand from chest, palm facing left, forward in large arc.

praise Put fingertips to your lips (with hand flat); move hand away from your mouth.

to the Lord.” Move right hand, palm facing left, from above head downward in front of face in an inward arc.

1 Chronicles 16:8 . . . Put palms together; then open.

LESSON 8

Use the following words and sing the memory verse to the tune of “Alleluia.”

Psalm 30, verse 12.

LESSON 9

Sing the following words to the tune of “Cheerful Giver.” (See page 64.)

Cheerful givers God loves.

LESSON 10

Use the suggested motions as you say the memory verse.

“Burst into songs Crouch on the floor and jump up with arms raised.

. . . together.” Spread arms out wide.

LESSON 11

Use the suggested motions as you say the memory verse.

“You Point to others.

are my Point to self.

friends.” Hug self, or hug others.

John 15:14 Put palms together; then open.

LESSON 12

Use the suggested motions as you say the memory verse.

“A friend Hold hands together.

loves Cross arms over chest.

at all times.” Spread arms wide.

Proverbs 17:17 Put palms together; then open.

LESSON 13

Use the suggested motions as you say the memory verse.

“Do not forget Shake head no.

. . . to share Place hands on chest, moving forward in an arc to waist.

with others.” Point to other people.

Hebrews 13:16 Put palms together; then open.
