Memory Verse

"Then God blessed the seventh day and made it holy" (Genesis 2:3).



Objectives

The children will: Know that God created the Sabbath to be a special day for us to come together, to remember what He made for us, and to worship Him. Feel that Sabbath is the most important day of the week. **Respond** by enjoying the Sabbath in special ways and thanking God for it.



The Message

I worship God when enjoy His weekly gift, the Sabbath.

God's Special Gift

Monthly Theme

We learn why we worship God.

The Bible Lesson at a Glance

God makes the Sabbath day after His busy work of creating the world. He creates this day to spend special time with the people that He created.

This is a lesson about worship.

The Sabbath has been a special day since Creation. It is a time to rest, to enjoy the things God made for us, and to worship and praise Him for all He has done and continues to do for us.

Teacher Enrichment

Sabbath-"After God had 'finished' creating the earth He 'rested on the seventh day from all his work' (Genesis 2:1, 2). This 'rest' was not because of weariness or fatigue (Isaiah 40:28), but because the task was complete, and the world perfect (see Genesis 1:31). . . . He ceased His labors because His handiwork could not be improved upon. . . . That the Creator intended the Sabbath blessing for all men of all time is evident from the declaration that it was 'made for man' (Mark 2:27), with the intention that man should use it for holy purposes. Accordingly, the [seventh] day is a day of rest for all who reckon their descent from Adam and Eve, not for the Jews alone. . . . The word 'remember,' with which the Sabbath command begins, does not imply that the observance of the [fourth] commandment is more important than the other nine, for all are of equal importance (see James 2:8-11). God's people were to 'remember' the Sabbath because 'in six days the Lord made heaven and earth, the sea, and all that in them is, and rested the seventh day'-that is, as a memorial of the Creator and Creation" (The SDA Bible Dictionary, p. 959).

Room Decorations

Use large sheets of paper and trace around the children as they pose in prayer fashion. Write "(Child's name) Worships God," on each child's silhouette. Mount these praying figures on the walls around the room.

Bulletin board ideas:

(Choose those ideas that best suit your needs.)

- 1. Caption: "God Hears Our Prayers." Each child traces one pair of praying hands. Write their name on it and mount the hands on the board. Use multicolored paper.
- 2. Caption: "We Worship the God of Creation." Put Creation circles on the board. Felt Creation scenes are available at some Adventist Book Centers.

3. Caption: "And God Blessed the Seventh Day and Made It Holy." Cut out a large number 7 the length of the board. Choose pictures of Sabbath activities and add to the numeral.

If you don't have bulletin boards, use masking tape on a wall to make a bulletin board shape.

TEACHING THE LESSON

You Need:

 balloons with string or ribbon

Welcome

Prepare in advance: Blow up balloons and write "Happy Sabbath" on them. If possible, use helium. Tie a "Happy Sabbath" balloon on each child's chair.

Greet the children at the door by saying **Happy Sabbath**. Say: **Sabbath** is a gift from God, a special day! Welcome to Sabbath School. Let us rejoice and celebrate on this day the Lord has made.

Then have the students begin the Readiness Activity of your choice.



Readiness Activities

Select the activity most appropriate for your situation.

You Need:

- bowl
- · slips of paper

A. Worship Mimes

Ahead of time, write on slips of paper various ways to enjoy Sabbath. Fold the papers and mix them up in the bowl.

Ask for a volunteer to come up and pull a paper out of the bowl. That child must then act out the activity written on the paper without using words or sounds. The other children should call out guesses as to what the activity is until someone guesses correctly. Continue with other volunteers until the bowl is empty.

If you have a small class, adults may also participate in acting and guessing.

Debriefing

Ask: What do you do on Sabbath? (Accept answers.) How do you feel about your Sabbaths? (Accept answers and discuss as needed.) What are some special things that you and your family do on the Sabbath that help you to think about God and enjoy His gift? (Allow discussion time.) What can you do to make your Sabbaths even happier? Today's message tells me:

Say that with me.

You Need:

- medium-size box
- pens/pencils
- paper

B. Troubles Box

Before Sabbath, decorate the box and clearly label it "SABBATH." Close the top so that there is only one large slit open.

Distribute paper and writing utensils to the children. Instruct them to write on the paper all the things they have been worrying about and chores they have to do next week (visit sick friend or relative, test in school, parent wanting them to clean their room, etc.). When they finish, have them fold the paper and stick it through the slot in the box marked "SABBATH."

Debriefing

Ask: Do you spend a lot of time thinking about the things you wrote? Do you ever wish you could just stop thinking about them for a while? (yes, no, sometimes) Do you ever wish they would just go away? (yes) Why do you suppose we put the lists in a box marked "SABBATH"? (don't know; because you said to) Can you see your lists through the box? (no, of course not)

Say: The box is like the Sabbath. God gave us the Sabbath as a place where we can put away our troubles and not look at them for a whole day. Then we can focus on worshipping God and experiencing His love for us. That's what our message means when it says:



I WORSHIP GOD WHEN I ENJOY HIS WEEKLY GIFT, THE SABBATH.

Say that with me.

Prayer and Praise Any Time



Fellowship

Report the students' joys and sorrows (pleased and troubled) as reported to you at the door (as appropriate). Review the memory verse and allow time for sharing experiences from last week's lesson study. Acknowledge any birthdays, special events, or achievements. Give a special warm greeting to all visitors.


Mission

Share a story from *Children's Mission*. Tell the children that boys and girls all over the world worship and enjoy God's gift of the Sabbath.



Offering

Say: The Sabbath is a special gift from God to us. Let's say Thank You to God by giving a gift to Him.



You Need:



Prayer

Have each child tell one thing that they enjoy about Sabbath. Then try a popcorn prayer. Form a circle and kneel. Ask the children to thank God for Sabbath and for the one thing they mentioned. Have them do this like popcorn popping—speaking out from anywhere in the circle at any time. Close with a prayer of thanks for God's Sabbath gift and the opportunity to worship God on His holy day.

Experiencing the Story

Characters: Mom and Tyler **Props:** Sitting on couch or chair that seats two, wrapped gift with something inside to represent Sabbath

Note: Sabbath School leaders in some countries may prefer to mention another local festive holiday or a birthday instead of Christmas.

Read or tell the story.

"I can't wait until Christmas!" Tyler announced. Mom looked up and laughed. "Tyler! It's only May [or a month far away from the alternate holiday you've chosen]! I'd say you have a while to wait!"

"I know," Tyler groaned.

"So tell me why you can't wait until Christmas," coaxed Mom.

"OK, but may I play Christmas music?"

As Tyler put the CD into the player he said, "I wish it were Christmas because I love being together with our whole family—grandpas, grandmas, cousins, everybody! I like having time to play games and do things that we don't always get to do. Of course I love the presents, but I really liked giving that food basket to the Johnsons last year. And, I'm starving for some of your famous Christmas rolls [or special local food]!"

"You've been thinking about this quite a bit today, haven't you?" Mom smiled.

"Yeah, I guess so!" Tyler plopped down beside Mom on the couch.

"I've got good news for you, son!" She watched Tyler's face light up. "Jesus knows how you feel! In fact, that's exactly why He created the Sabbath for us." Mom laughed again, seeing Tyler's confused look. "OK, think about it. God made the Sabbath day after His busy work of Creation. He created a day just to spend with the people He created! It's His favorite day of the week! He wants the Sabbath to be a kind of holiday every single week. A time to forget about all of the regular things we do all week, and just have a special day with Him.

"All of the things you mentioned enjoying about Christmas are things we enjoy about Sabbath too. We get to be with people we love; we do special things that don't happen every day; and we love to do things that can help make others happy. We even love having special food!" Mom grinned and reached over with a hug.

"I never thought about Sabbath being like a holiday," Tyler responded. He was really thinking about what Mom had just said.

"You know," Mom added, "Jesus really looks forward to spending Sabbath with us. His love for us is so big. When He gave us the Ten Commandments, He said, 'Remember the Sabbath day. Work hard with Me all week, and then have a holiday with Me every Sabbath.' Taking that special time with Him at the end of our busy week and thanking Him for the beautiful things He's made for us to enjoy are ways we tell Jesus that we love Him too!" Mom could tell that Tyler had forgotten how far away Christmas was.

How about you? Sabbath is God's gift to you each week! [Open wrapped gift with something inside to represent the Sabbath.] When God finished creating the world in six days, He rested on the seventh day. He blessed it and made it holy. Ever since Creation, the Sabbath holiday has been a special day to worship God, to tell

Him how much we love Him. It is a holy holiday! This Sabbath and every Sabbath, Jesus looks forward to the extra time we spend in worship.

Debriefing

Ask: How is Sabbath like a special holiday? (no work, no school, special family time, food, special time with the One we love the most-God) What are some things you do to make your Sabbaths the best day of all? (worship God in church, spend time with God's creation, family time, music, etc.) When are you happier-on Friday night when Sabbath comes or on Saturday night when Sabbath is over? (Accept answers and discuss as needed. Place emphasis on positive reasons for enjoying Sabbath activities.) Let's say our message together:

Memory Verse

You Need:

- Bibles
- small pieces of paper
- balloon for each memory verse word

Prepare in advance: Write each word of the memory verse on an individual piece of paper. Insert the papers into balloons, one paper for each balloon. (This may

be part of your room decor for the day.) Attach the balloons to the wall, table, or floor.

Ask each child to use their Bibles to find and read today's memory verse. "And God blessed the seventh day and made it holy" (Genesis 2:3). Allow the

children to burst the balloons. The children are to gather the words collected from the balloons and arrange them in their proper order. Scramble the papers and repeat until children know the verse.

You may want to teach the fourth commandment to the children, or challenge them to learn it on their own.

Bible Study

Read aloud Exodus 20:8-11. Ask: When the text says we should not do any work, does it mean that we should just sit and do nothing? Allow discussion time. No. There are some things we should not do, but there are others that are especially good to do on the Sabbath.

Let's read some texts about Sabbath activities. If the text tells about things you might enjoy doing on Sabbath, stand up.

Assign students to read one text each.

Luke 13:10 (teaching in church) Psalm 41:3 (visiting/healing the sick) John 5:8, 9 (healing a cripple) Matthew 17:18 (casting out demons) Matthew 12:11, 13 (doing good) Psalm 146:7 (feeding the hungry)

Debriefing

Ask: What did Jesus do on **Sabbath?** (things that helped people) What do you think about helping others on Sabbath? What can you do to help people this Sabbath? Let's say our message together:

Applying the Lesson

You Need:

- pencils

Our Sabbath Plan

Distribute "Our Sabbath Plan" to each child. (See page 141.)

Say: Holidays are different from other days. We do different things to celebrate them. Earlier you shared some of the special things that you and your family do on God's holy holiday—the Sabbath—that help you to think about God and enjoy His gift.

Think about next Sabbath. Write on your Sabbath Plan paper some ideas that will make Sabbath a happy day for your family. (See page 141.) Remember that Sabbath is a day to spend special family time with Jesus and to enjoy His creation. Share your ideas with your family and plan to have a very happy Sabbath next week. Allow time. Adults assist as necessary.

Debriefing

Ask: What is your favorite food for Sabbath? (Accept answers.) What is your favorite activity? What do you think about helping to plan your next Sabbath? (Happy that I can have a part in my family's plans; I don't have any ideas, etc.)

Why is it good to plan ahead for Sabbath? (We will be ready to enjoy it more.) How would God like us to celebrate Sabbath? (Spend time with family and friends; help people; go to Sabbath School and church; read our Bibles; pray; rest; enjoy nature; praise God; etc.) Let's say today's message:

Sharing the Lesson

Sabbath Is for Everyone

Have the children create an invitation to Sabbath School to give to a friend who is not a Seventh-day Adventist. They might wish to include an invitation to Sabbath dinner and a Sabbath afternoon activity.

Option: Have the class invite friends to a special Visitors Day that includes a potluck meal following Sabbath services.

Debriefing

Ask: To whom do you plan to give the invitation that you made? (Accept answers.) How do you feel when you share the Sabbath with someone else?

(Making someone else happy makes me happy, etc.) Why should we share the joy of the Sabbath with others who might not know about it? Let's read Mark 2:27. (Because Sabbath was made for everyone to enjoy.) What does our message say? Say together with enthusiasm:

Closing

Daily Activities

Sabbath

- Find a quiet place in nature and read your lesson story with your family. Try to find things
 God made on each of the days of Creation.
- If you made a list of ideas for making Sabbath special in Sabbath School, share it with your family. If you did not make a list, create one with your family, and plan to do one of the items.
- Teach your memory verse to your family.
- Thank God for family time.

Sunday

- During worship time, read and discuss Exodus 20:8 together.
- Make a clock face out of stiff paper or a paper plate. Attach the hour and minute hands with a fastener. Write on the clock "Sabbath Begins at . . ." Find out when sunset comes this Friday. (Look at a sunset schedule or church bulletin.) Set the clock hands to that time. Put your clock on your refrigerator to remind you to be ready for Sabbath at sundown Friday.
- Say your memory verse together. Thank God for His love and for the Sabbath.

Monday

- During family worship, ask someone to read about the first Sabbath (Genesis 2:1-3). Draw a picture of the first Sabbath. Write your memory verse at the bottom. Pray that you will think about Jesus every day this week, and that you will be ready for His special Sabbath time.
- Ask your family to help you learn God's Sabbath commandment (Exodus 20:8-11).

Tuesday

• Today would be a good day to give the invita-

- tion to Sabbath School to your friend. At worship tonight, talk about your friend's response.
- Say your memory verse together. Tell your family: "Sabbath is a gift from God. I love Sabbath because ."
- Read or say together God's Sabbath commandment in Exodus 20:8-11. Then say this commandment in your own words. Thank God for His special holy holiday.

Wednesday

• With your family, read and discuss these texts. List what you discover about ways to worship God on Sabbath.

Proverbs 25:11 Exodus 15:1 Matthew 6:6 Romans 15:31 Psalm 47:1 Matthew 2:11 Psalm 145:1

Must you wait until Sabbath to do these things?
 Ask Jesus to help you worship Him every day.

Thursday

- During family worship, read about preparing for Sabbath in Exodus 16:14-16, 21-26. Then say your memory verse together.
- With your family, make a Sabbath plan. Make sundown worship part of your Friday evening plans. Ask others in your family to do special things. Choose some songs.
- Ask God to bless your plans.

Friday

- Light some candles for sundown worship. Say
 the fourth (Sabbath) commandment together.
 Follow the worship plans you made yesterday.
 As part of your worship, have your family join
 you in saying your memory verse.
- Read Mark 2:27. Why did God make the Sabbath? Thank Him for it.
- Is your friend coming to Sabbath School with you tomorrow? Pray for a happy Sabbath day.
