READ Read Ezr Up the Temple." LEARN Take a v READ Read Ezra 4:1-5 and this week's story, "Building

LEARN Take a walk and think about the power text.

THINK For what might the Lord have chosen you?

PRAY Pray about each part of the text. Ask God to show you what He has chosen for you to do.

READ Read Ezra 4:6-24.

THINK Have you ever received a message telling you to stop doing something good? Why did the enemies of the Jews try to stop them from rebuilding Jerusalem?

REVIEW Review the power text.

PRAY Ask God to be with you when someone tries to stop you from doing something He wants you to do.

READ Read Ezra 5.

FIND Look up the word "tattle" in the dictionary. Who in Ezra 5 acted like this?

THINK How do you feel when someone tattles on you? Have you ever tattled on anyone?

NOTE Remember to speak to a trusted adult if someone is doing or threatening to do something harmful.


REVIEW Review the power text.

PRAY Thank God for being with you and prompting you to serve and worship Him.

The Samaritans wrote a letter to King Artaxerxes, accusing the Jews of building a rebellious and evil city. "Let it now be known to the king that, if this city is built and the walls completed, they will not pay tax, tribute, or custom, and the king's treasury will be diminished," they wrote. "We inform the king that if this city is rebuilt and its walls are completed, the result will be that you will have no dominion beyond the River" (verses 13, 16).

The king replied, "Now give the command to make these men cease, that this city may not be built until the





READ Read Ezra 6:1-12.

THINK The truth always wins, but sometimes it takes time. Ask an adult to tell you an experience they had with overcoming discouragement.

REMEMBER Praise God even when you are discouraged.

REVIEW Review the power text.

PRAY Praise God for His help through tough situations.

READ Read Ezra 6:13-18.

THINK How did the Israelites celebrate the building of the Temple?

PLAN What can you do to celebrate as you praise God? Record your answer in your Bible study journal.

REVIEW Review the power text.

PRAY Praise God for His love and care for you.

READ Read Ezra 6:19-22.

REFLECT The Jews never gave up their dream or rebuilding the Temple. They persevered even though they discouraged, because they wanted to worship God.


CREATE Get together with your family and create a banner that encourages you to persevere. With their permission, take it to Sabbath School to show to your class.


REPEAT Say the power text aloud by memory.




KEEPING THE FAITH
