What do you think when you look at your baby pictures or book and see some gifts that people gave you before you were even born? Perhaps your mom has even saved a few of those gifts. Did you know God gave you a gift, a priceless gift, even before you were born? even before the world was born?

LEARN Begin to learn the power text, John 1:1-3.

THINK What is the best gift you ever received? Why?

PRAY Thank God for His wonderful gifts to you.

Monday

READ Read John 1:6-8.

FIND Look up the word "grace" in a dictionary. In your own words, explain how grace relates to these verses.

LIST If showing grace to someone means that somehow you won't get what you deserve, how can you be filled with grace anyway? List ways you can show grace.

REVIEW Review the power text.

PRAY Ask God to make you a person full of grace toward others.

Tuesday

READ Read John 1:9-18.

THINK What can you do to share the greatest gift to us?

WRITE Write about a time you gave a gift but felt as if the person didn't want it or like it. What did it feel like?

REVIEW Review the power text.

PRAY Thank God for the gift of Jesus and tell Him you accept and love His gift.

Wednesday

READ Read Ephesians 2:8.

WRAP Wrap a small box in Christmas wrapping and put colorful ribbon on it. Then write Ephesians 2:8 on a card and attach it to the gift-wrapped box. Place the box in your room to remind you of God's greatest gift to you.

ASK Ask an adult about baby gifts that were given to you before you were born. How did the people know what to get? How did your mother feel about those gifts?

REVIEW Review the power text.

PRAY Ask God for the grace to appreciate His greatest gift and what it cost.

Thursday

READ Read Colossians 1:16, 17.

SHARE Write Ephesians 2:8 on some cardstock. Fold each into a Christmas card of your own design. Draw or paint a Christmas illustration on the cover and mail it to someone who may need encouragement during the holiday season.

PLAY Play a recording of the hymn "Amazing Grace."

THINK The writer of "Amazing Grace" was a former slave ship captain who became converted to Christianity. Why do you think the words of this song were especially meaningful to such a person?

REVIEW Review the power text.

PRAY Pray for all those who are slaves to sin and do not understand the gift of grace God has already given them.

Friday

READ Read John 3:16.

EXPLAIN Explain in your own words the meaning of the following quotation: "The gospel is open to all; the most respectable sinner has no more claim on it than the worst" (Martyn Lloyd-Jones).

DISCUSS How does it feel being called a child of God? What responsibilities and privileges does that give you?

SAY Repeat the power text, John 1:1-3, by memory.


PRAY With your family, thank God that you are all His children, and thank Him together for His gifts to you.
