We accept God's gift of salvation as we seek to spend time with Jesus daily.

Tuesday

READ Read Jeremiah 29:12.

LOOK Look through your Bible study guide and review the lessons. Which is your favorite? Why?

SHARE Tell an adult about your favorite lesson.

REVIEW Review the power text.

PRAY Pray the prayer listed in Sunday's activity box. Plan to have it memorized by Sabbath so that you can use it anytime to give your life to God day by day.

LIST In your Bible study journal, list (1) the things God plans for us, (2) the things we will do, and (3) the promises God makes.

REVIEW Review the power text.

PRAY Pray the prayer listed in Sunday's activity box.

Friday

READ Read Psalm 63:1.

DISCUSS At family worship, talk about what it is like when your soul thirsts for God.

RECITE Say your power text to your family at worship.

ASK Ask an adult to read God's promise in Jeremiah 29:14 aloud.

EXPLAIN Tell your family about the prayer you learned to help you seek the Lord each day.

SING Sing together "Father, I Adore You."

PRAY Pray together the prayer you have learned this week.
